Approximately one out of every twenty-one people in the state is of Hispanic origin.

Counties with the highest percentage Hispanic or Latino origin were **Duplin (15.1%)**, Lee (11.7%), Sampson (10.8%), Montgomery (10.4%), Chatham (9.6%), Green (8%), Johnston (7.7%), Durham (7.6%), Onslow (7.2%), and Hoke (7.2%). The municipalities with more than one Hispanic out of every five residents are Robbins (48.4%), Siler City (39.3%), Candor (27%), Dobson (25.8%), **Magnolia (25.1%)**, **Faison (24.7%)**, Biscoe (23.2%), Monroe (21.4%), and Rennert (21.2%).

Notes: *Hispanics can be of any race. Also, in the categories given above, American Indians includes Eskimo and Aleut.*
