




Duplin County's Demographics








Duplin County Student Membership Years 2008-2018










Percentage of the Unemployment Rate in North Carolina Versus Duplin County





Household Income for Duplin County 2018

















Poverty Rate for Children (Under 18 years of age)


Congressional Budget Office







Number Produced (Thousand Head)









HOGSNumber on Farms, December 1 (*Thousand Head*)












