The North Carolina Department of Public Safety (NCDPS) anticipates annual funds in the above stated amount will be available for programs serving delinquent and at-risk youth beginning on or after July 1, 2024. Local match rate for JCPC funds required: 10%. \*

As a result of the Needs Assessment in the above named county, programs that reduce risk, address the needs of juveniles, and increase protective factors will be considered for funding.

Elevated risk and needs for juveniles in the county:

- o Juveniles with some risk but also having low needs and moderate to very high strengths, but 84% had prior referrals; state was only at 45%;
- o Juveniles under 12 are at 15% with the state at 10%; still getting significant number of school-based offense referrals, and 60% had prior police reports filed by school, state at only 27%; and youths are either participating in school-based activities or are interested in doing so;
- o Person crimes, are elevated including simple assault, affray, among others, much of which appears to be school-based

Protective Factors to address risk and needs:

Prosocial peers; strong school motivation; self-efficacy.
